After some considerable success Browder closed shop in Russia and moved back to London, but his Russian attorney, Serge Magnitsky, remained, was arrested, and eventually beaten to death while in detention. "Freezing Order is the tale, ultimately successful, of Browder's efforts to implement a law called the Magnitsky Act in this country and throughout the world. The law, vigorously and viciously opposed by Vladimir Putin, allows courts to freeze assets which belong to human rights abusers.

Dick Kauffman recommended the book while Richard Black led the discussion with Mac McLaughlin, John Riordan, Richard Rossland, Mike Schneider, Tim Tinnes, Nick Bowles, Jim Flessner, Paul Freitas, Garret Girvan, John Kopchik, Larry Setren and Richard White.

The group awarded the book a solid 4.0 stars.

Book Club 2 met December 15 to discuss <u>The Girl</u> <u>with Seven Names</u> by Hyeonseo Lee.

This book provides insight into life under one of the world's most ruthless and secretive dictatorships – and the story of one woman's terrifying struggle to avoid capture/repatriation and guide her family to freedom.

As a child growing up in North Korea, Hyeonseo Lee was one of millions trapped by a secretive and brutal totalitarian regime. Her home on the border with China gave her some exposure to the world beyond the confines of the Hermit Kingdom and, as the famine of the 1990s struck, she began to wonder, question and to realize that she had been brainwashed her entire life. Given the repression, poverty and starvation she witnessed surely her country could not be, as she had been told "the best on the planet"?

Aged seventeen, she decided to escape North Korea. She could not have imagined that it would be twelve years before she was reunited with her family.

This is the unique story not only of Hyeonseo's escape from darkness into light, but also of her coming of age, education and the resolve she found to rebuild her life – not once, but twice – first in China, then in South Korea. Strong, brave and eloquent, this memoir is a triumph of her remarkable spirit.


