Book Club 2 met April 20 to discuss the book Horse by Geraldine Brooks.

Despite the simplicity of the title, the authors novel is a heart-pounding American epic that gallops backwood and forward in time to tell a story about race and freedom, horses and art, and the lineage of not just ancestors but actions. In present day we meet Theo Northam, a black art historian who is researching 19th century equestrian paintings, and Jess, a bone specialist who is called to help uncover an old horse skeleton lost somewhere in the Smithsonian. When the reader flashes back to the 1850's, there is Jarret Lewis, an enslaved groom for Lexington---a horse that will become the fastest thoroughbred ever to race---who desperately wants
to be free but will do anything for the horse he's raised, Weaving together these different narratives, Horse tells a distinctly American story that shines a light on the legacy of slavery and the pursuit of independence. Like the races Lexington runs, this is a fast, exciting, and all together remarkable read.
The 12 members in attendance rated the book 4.8, the highest rated book we have ever read. We thank Fred Schafer for the recommendation.

## 40 Second Golf Rule

New USGA Rule: Rule 5.6 encourages prompt pace of play by recommending that:

- Players should recognize that their pace of play affects others and they should play promptly throughout the round (such as by preparing in
advance for each stroke and moving promptly between strokes and in going to the next tee),
- A player should make a stroke in no more than 40 seconds (and usually in less time) after the player is able to play without interference or distraction.
