
SIR Luncheon

"The Brief Reign and Tragic Demise of the American Rigid Airship" by John J Geoghegan

TALK DESCRIPTION: John will talk about the true but little-known U.S. Navy program to build a fleet of giant Zeppelins based in the Bay Area designed to patrol the Pacific to prevent a surprise attack by Japan in the days before radar. His talk is based on his recent book, When Giants Ruled the Sky: The Brief Reign and Tragic Demise of the American Rigid Airship and his recent appearance in the Smithsonian Channel's documentary, America's Lost Airship.

BIO: John J. Geoghegan specializes in reporting on unusual inventions that fail in the marketplace despite their innovative nature. He began his journalism career as a Special Correspondent for the New York Times, is the author of four, nonfiction books, and numerous newspaper and magazine articles. We explored Bordeaux wine with a first tasting of blanc wine from area of Cadillac AOC – France. Following were each of three principal varietals of the Bordeaux Rouge: Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Cabernet Franc. The

final tasting, the blended result of these varietals,

was 2020 Bordeaux Rouge from several wineries. Thirty-two guests enjoyed the wine, but in our opinion, Bordeaux is second best to Napa Valley Cabernets. In a 1976 Paris wine blind tasting, Napa Cabernet was judged #1 over French Bordeaux. A bonus tasting was offered of Mead, wine from the fermentation of honey.

Just before November's Thanksgiving will be the final 2023 WineOSir tasting, the third Thursday at 4:00. Put it on your calendar for camaraderie of Sirs and their best!

On Sunday, November 5, 2023, Walking Tours activity is visiting the Treasure Island complex. The tour starts at 10 AM in the Art Deco Building 1, 1 Avenue of Palms, San Francisco, CA, 94130. This building was originally designed as the air terminal for Pan America Airways during the years of the Clipper flights across the Pacific (1938-1945). Before entering the building participants will see the 4 Pacific Unity Sculptures. Once inside, they will view TI Naval History Mural, 251 feet wide. The free TI Museum presents the "You Are Here: The Story of Treasure Island" exhibit. The Exhibit explains how the island has been used for public and military roles. Lastly, the participants will enjoy 1 hour slide lectures covering the 1939-40 Golden Gate International Exposition. Everything is in color and you will see GGIE as it was in 1939. The presentation is being done by Ms Anne Schnoebelen, Vice President, TI Museum. The cost for the presentation is \$15 per person.

Book Group 2 Scott Clark

Book Group 2 met on Thursday, September 21, to discuss "Operation Pedestal" "the fleet that battled in Malta 1942" by Max Hastings.

Malta is a small island that lies near the center of the Mediterranean Sea between Sicily and the coast of North Africa. Max Hastings is an historian who provides a well-researched and very detailed and accurate description of a fleet of mostly British naval and merchant vessels which sailed from Gibraltar to Malta from August 9 to August 15 in 1942. The British controlled Malta, from which it had been attacking German supply lines to German troops in North Africa. Malta had been under siege by German and Italian forces since 1940 and without getting more fuel, supplies and other provisions to the island, Malta would fall to the Germans.

The Pedestal fleet consisted of two battleships, five aircraft carriers, 11 escorts, seven cruisers, 23 destroyers, six minesweepers, nine submarines, an ocean tug, 14 merchant vessels, and 146 war planes. Despite the British commitment to the largest fleet the Royal Navy committed to action since 1916, for five straight days the fleet ran into an equally strong and determined German and Italian resistance that resulted in numerous bloody air-sea battles. In the end, the British suffered the loss of nine merchant ships, an aircraft carrier, two cruisers, a destroyer, and 457 men. Ultimately four merchant ships and a tanker, survived to bring the needed food, fuel, and supplies. It was a tactical victory for the Axis but a strategic win for the Allies.

As in any war, the book described many events that were going on at the same time. Some characters were mentioned throughout the story, but it was difficult to follow the numerous characters throughout the book. The group's criticism of the book was that it was at times confusing and overly detailed. On the other hand, it made the reader a part of an important battle during World II. The group gave the book an overall rating of 3.1 out of 5.

The next Book Club 2 meeting will be on **Thursday**, **October 19**, at 1 pm at the Ygnacio Valley library on Oak Grove Road in Walnut Creek. The group will discuss, "The Lost City of the Monkey God" by Douglas Preston. Our November book will be "The Wager" by David Grann. We welcome anyone who is interested to join us.
