

10. MAKE IT EASY FOR OTHERS TO PLAY FASTER

11. MINIMIZE THE DAMAGE OF A LOST BALL

The entire foursome does not have to look for a ball. Two can look, two should play.

FINALLY, IF ALL ELSE FAILS...

Book Club 2 August book was <u>Billion Dollar Whale:</u> <u>The Man Who Fooled Wall Street</u>, by Tom Wright & Bradley Hope.

A true story of greed and hubris from two Wall Street Journal reporters, Billion Dollar Whale reveals how a young Malaysian social climber pulled off one of the biggest financial heists in history - right under the nose of the global financial industryexposing the shocking secret of elite wealth, banking, Hollywood, and politics. The dust had yet to settle on the 2009 global financial crisis when an unlikely Wharton grad, Jho Low, was setting in motion a fraud of unprecedented gall and magnitude, one that would come to symbolize the next great threat to the global financial system. To be sure, Low had plenty of help from a corrupt Malaysian prime minister, Goldman Sachs, numerous banks and investors, and compliance officers who were only too willing to look the other way and ignore their own protocols for monitoring investments.

O'Neill is America's only Nobel Prize-winning playwright. He lived at Tao House in the hills above Danville from 1936-194, where he authored many notable works including "Long Day's Journey into Night" and "The Iceman Cometh." "Anna Christie" premiered in the 1920s, and evolved to become one of O'Neill's most popular works, and one of his only two comedies.


